Howdy Duty

On 15 November 1950, I joined the COANG and was assigned to the 140th Motor Vehicle Squadron and given a vehicle mechanic AFSC. A few months later, I went into Unit Supply. Bob Talbot was my First Sergeant. In those years, we drilled on four Thursday nights and one Sunday, per month.

The 140TFW was activated on 1 April 1951 along with units from Colorado, Utah and Wyoming for the Korea War. We re-activated Clovis AFB that had been closed after WWII. Our mission aircraft was the P-51. I went back to my civilian job in auto body repair after being released on 7 September '52.

On 12 May 1953, I accepted a full-time position as the supply man in the Motor Pool, at \$285 per month. A year later I married my lifetime partner, Peggy. Unit supplies were eventually eliminated and I became the Senior NCO/Supervisor of the Base Equipment Management

Office. I was activated again for the Berlin Crisis from October '61 to August '62. This activation was pretty much uneventful since most our time was at the base except for rotations to George AFB, CA, where our F-100s were based during runway repair at Buckley.

For the 3rd time I was called to active duty from January '68 to January '69, for the Pueblo Crisis. The Wing Headquarters and many of us were sent to Cannon AFB. I became part of the newly formed Combat Crew Training Squadron as senior NCO of the supply section. Our primary mission was converting from multi-engine to fighter aircraft. Upon return from active duty, I resumed my duties in the Equipment Management Office. The functions of this office were merged into Base Supply, so in August 1976, I began a very interesting career as a Contract Administrator/Contracting Officer for the Architect, Construction and Service contracts. I retired from Civil Service on 30 December 1987.

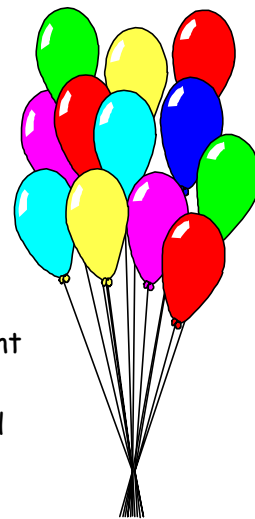

I wished to remain in the Guard and was accepted for a Services slot in 240CEF. This was a very special unit to me to close out my military career. In January 1991, during Desert Shield, three of us were sent to Tyndall AFB, FL, for special Mortuary Affairs Training. We were activated the next month for Desert Storm. Our duties were in the Command Post of the Air Force Mortuary Affairs Office. I will always remember one case file I worked on concerning an A-10 pilot who was shot down over Iraq. He appeared on Iraqi TV so we knew he was alive. (He spent a total of 46 days in captivity.) A number of years later, I learned that he was the nephew of a close friend and got to meet this brave pilot. He became a tanker pilot for the Washington State ANG. I was released from active duty on 15 March 1991.

Peggy was able to accompany me on my last AFT to Hickham AFB, HI. She got to play while I worked in the HQ PACAF office. We did have *some* free time together.

I retired from the 240CEF on 28 October 1991 because my 60th birthday was two days later. I am grateful for my career and friends from my 41 years with the Guard. My most unforgettable character would be Tom Linam. General Moffit was most special to all of us. My travels were priceless, and specially my AFT to Holland, which allowed me to visit my Father's birthplace and visit relatives.

We have earned many rewards in retirement, so Peggy and I decided it was "payback" time and got involved with volunteer work. We left much of this in Denver when we moved to Arizona in 2005. We are now into our 18th year of disaster relief service. We volunteer three weeks a year to repair/rebuild homes that have been damaged/destroyed in disasters.

We are also thankful to the OSOTMG for keeping us informed.
