A few years ago one of our retired G.I.'s asked a half dozen of us to meet him at the N.C.O. Club for lunch. We met at 10:30 A.M., had a few beers to whet our appetites then ordered lunch around 1:30 P.M. After lunch we had a few more beers for the road. About 5:00 P.M. we decided it was about time to leave when someone remarked what a good time we were having and it was a shame that so many of our old friends were missing out on our good time. He suggested that we have lunch more often and invite a few more retirees. So, we sat back down and discussed the matter.

We decided to meet once a month for lunch and invite retirees from Buckley: military and civilians from the Air Guard, Army Guard, Navy & Marine Reserves and invited guests.

We didn't want anything fancy, just wear jeans, sport shirts, tennis shoes, etc. No written rules or regulations, since we never followed them in the past and weren't about to change. We just wanted to keep in touch with our old friends and try to forgive those who might have ticked us off in the past, if that were possible.

There is no such thing as rank in our organization. We are all on a first name basis as we have been for years. General (that's his first name) Joe forgets and raises his voice sometimes, but we don't jump as fast or as high as we used to.

We meet at our old N.C.O. Club (now called the CAMANA Club) at 11:30 A.M. the first Tuesday of the month unless there is a holiday and the base is closed. In that case, we meet the 2nd Tuesday. We started with six, and we now have over 150 members. There are no dues. We pass the poverty basket at some of the meetings and receive donations from out of town members. We use the money for postage, get-well and sympathy cards, and birthday cakes.

We also like to keep up on things that are happening at Buckley. A lot of folks spent many years building the unit, and we want to make sure the younger generation doesn't take on very many customs of their Air Force cousins. We could always out-fight and out-shoot the Air Force with one-tenth the manpower and with hand-me-down airplanes and equipment. We hope we can help preserve the old Air Guard traditions.




