With the numerous changes occurring on the base, I dug out a book titled Nearer The Sky on the history of the Colorado Air National Guard and read an account of the base origin. A few excerpts from the book are the base was named after First Lieutenant John Harold Buckley who was a member of the Colorado National Guard. During his senior year at Colorado University he was placed on active duty. He went through OCS at Fort Riley, Kansas, received his flying training and became an outstanding pilot. During the third day of the Meuse Argonne Offensive, September 27, 1918, he volunteered for a strafing mission behind enemy lines and was killed at the young age of 22. In 1941 the base was part of a 100 square mile bombing range for Lowry. It was realized that Lowry would saturate their facilities and a portion of the bombing range became an auxiliary field. In the summer of 1941, the War Department, through the active interest of U.S. Senators Alva B. Adams and Edwin C. Johnson named the field in honor of First Lieutenant John Harold Buckley. In early 1946 the Army Air Corps order the field to be closed and the Guard took it over in the summer. In 1947 the Guard negotiated with the Navy who assumed command and it was known as Denver Naval Air Station until June 1959. The Colorado Air National Guard assumed command in 1959, and the base became Buckley Air National Guard Base the home of the Colorado Air National Guard.
